Our Taste for Chocolate

Chocolate is one of the most popular flavors in the world! Now it has become part of many traditional holiday celebrations, too. Chocolate is molded into shapes such as coins, hearts, rabbits and even Santa Claus. Confectioners¹ have engineered an entire language of swirls² for the top of chocolate pieces so you know what you have and what you're about to bite into. Confectioners have always pushed the limits and chocolate is no exception. It's not unusual to see chocolate covered cherries, an elaborate cake or delicate edible³ chocolate leaves. Chocolate doesn't need a special day; any day is a good day for chocolate. It wasn't always this way. Originally, more than 5,000 years ago, it started as an unsweetened beverage for the upper class.

Mesoamerican⁴ culture, which preceded the Aztec and the Mayan culture, first made drinks from the bitter⁵ cacao⁶ seeds. Their process resulted in a frothy drink mixture which they flavored by adding vanilla, honey, pepper and even salt. During that time, this drink was used only in ceremonies and not available to the common people. The cacao seeds at that period were considered a luxury. The actual seeds were so valuable that they were used as money. Of course, cacao is still valuable to this day.

Cacao seeds remain in demand worldwide. The original cacao plants are from South America and are still grown there. World production has expanded to Africa as well as Indonesia. Both markets are growing sources for the cacao seeds. The cacao seed industry uses small farms from around the globe, and all are near the climate of the equator.⁷

There is nothing that hasn't been thought of to be made into some edible confections and useful products. After being processed into cocoa butter, you then have the necessary product to begin to make chocolate. Cocoa butter is the crucial⁸ ingredient for chocolate, but also the base for a few other products including cosmetics, moisturizers and even soaps.

Cacao originated in the Americas, but is now popular around the world. We give credit to the early Mesoamericans for their first use of the cacao seeds while not forgetting the clever creations of the Swiss and Belgians who have made chocolate into the sweet confectionaries we know today. Their mutual discoveries have given us the enjoyment of chocolate, truly a worldwide taste, which we can enjoy in a variety of ways and as often as we like.
