#### The History and Culture of Carnivals in the USA

Our love of rides and entertainment is reflected in the success of amusement parks around the world. If you have been to one, then you have experienced the magic and the wonder of the park! As soon as you enter, you are overwhelmed¹ with many wonderful sights, sounds and smells, and the laughter of children seems to be everywhere. The parks offer an escape from everyday life and allow us to live for a while in a world of fantasy. Just the anticipation² of going to a large park like Disneyland and meeting the characters brings great joy to people of all ages! America has only two Disney amusement parks · Disneyland and Disney World. However, many Americans never get to visit the Disney parks. For Americans who cannot drive or fly thousands of miles to a Disney park, there are other choices in American culture called carnivals³ that give them an idea of the magic of a Disney park. And the best part is the carnivals often come right to your own town! A carnival is a traveling amusement park or circus. About the structure, the main area of a carnival is the central area called the midway⁴ (the word midway comes from the main avenue leading to the big top⁵ in a circus). In the midway of a carnival, there are various rides and attractions, food vendors, 6 games of chance and skill, freak shows, 7 thrill acts, and colorful tents for the shows and exhibits. A typical carnival has about forty employees and stays in your town for about a week before moving to the next town.

Carnivals have been a very important part of the American culture for centuries! The roots of the first carnival go back to the Chicago World's Fair in 1893. This fair, with its area that included rides and games of chance, inspired the traveling carnival. After the Chicago World's Fair, traveling carnival companies began touring the United States. In 1902, seventeen carnivals were on tour; by 1905 this number had risen to forty-six; and by 1937, in the carnivals' heyday, there were more than three hundred different carnivals that traveled around the USA. Most of the small carnivals did not survive for long, as the crowds were too outside of big cities, so many of the small carnival groups joined together to create a single carnival company. The biggest carnival company now is called "Amusements of America" with more than one hundred rides and attractions. The Ferris Wheel is a classic carnival ride that's still one of the most popular rides today! Whether it's the Ferris Wheel at your local carnival or the magical Cinderella Castle at Disney World, there's always a lot of magic waiting for you at carnivals and amusement parks! (459 words)

#### Car Safety Features

Car safety has improved a lot in recent years. Cars nowadays have many safety features that help protect people inside and outside the cars. Even cars that are not expensive have many advanced safety features. These features used to be only in luxury cars, but now they are in many cars. They help to prevent accidents and make drivers less tired. One of the most important safety features in cars today is airbags. They are made to inflate¹ very quickly if there is a crash. This provides a soft cushion for the people in the car and helps to prevent serious injuries.

The idea of car safety started in the early 1900s with the invention of seatbelts. They were first made to reduce the risk of whiplash,<sup>2</sup> which is a type of neck injury. Over time, other safety features like safety glass windshields,<sup>3</sup> and turn signals became standard in cars. In the late 1950s, the car company Volvo introduced the 3-point lap-sash seatbelt,<sup>4</sup> which is still used in cars today. This seatbelt spreads out the energy of the moving body over different areas, including the chest and shoulders.

In the future, car safety features are expected to become even better. For example, displays in cars could show 3D animations to the driver. This could provide real time navigation and show drivers the potential dangers on the road. Other new features could include headlamps<sup>5</sup> that adapt and improve visibility in low-light conditions, and systems that detect pedestrians<sup>6</sup> to prevent accidents.

As cars continue to change, so does car safety. The main goal of safety features in cars is to eventually of stop all deaths on the road due to human error. This car safety is very important for car makers, so with new research and development by them, we can look forward to even better safety features in the future. With each new feature, we are moving towards a future where roads are safer for everyone. (322 words)
