Water & Canals

People who have fresh water in volume will improve their lives through health and business. Water is essential¹ for life, as we know it. The importance of water and supply is vital to us all. While we use water to drink, clean, cook, and for farming, having fresh water available has not always been as easy as now.

The essence² of life is complete with the key element, water. Warm weather and a short walk in the park remind us quickly how a drink of water can make us feel, think, or relax. Life without water simply does not exist for us. We are mostly made of water and our entire life balances on having nearly 2.3 liters of drinking water daily.

The history of man has had our villages and town growth planned and built near water and seashores. Rivers are often the starting point for communities. Settlements³ near rivers allowed for easy movement, but guaranteed cities had water, which supported the people and agriculture. Today, water is currently brought to where we live. We generally use underground⁴ pipes, but think water will always flow in our kitchens and baths. In reality, only a few short years ago, fresh water was not the convenience it is today.

A few thousand years ago, the Romans developed methods of moving water great distances down mountains to large cities. They had a system of canals⁵ that used bridges called aqueducts⁶ to move fresh water into cities in Europe and North Africa. Even today, some aqueducts can be seen and remain in much the way the Romans built them. Clean water and sanitation⁷ helped people remain healthy and provided city growth to locations far from rivers. Their clever ideas led to many discoveries, which are still in use today.

Now we do not rely on aqueducts, but we do use the idea of moving water where needed. Our designs include pipes, tunnels, bridges, and pumps that move water to cities, towns and villages. This infrastructure⁸ helps us have clean water and sanitation, but it also helps communities to grow and to support agriculture where previously impossible.

It is just this thought that brought fresh water from Lake Inawashiro to Koriyama, Japan, through the Asaka Canal using a chain of tunnels and pipes. This early understanding and vision, made safe clean drinking water available to promote healthy living, the growth of farming, industry, and home life in our area and throughout the world.
